COMMENTARY TO THE TITLE

Organizations that consider the title *Code of Conduct* as too regulatory or prescriptive may recast it as they choose. The title is not intended to suggest that the Aviators Model Code of Conduct (AMCC) or any of its versions are or should be prescriptive, regulatory, or disciplinary. Codes are widely implemented for voluntary, aspirational general guidance purposes.

The Permanent Editorial Board (PEB) of the Aviators Code Initiative has considered the title and concluded:

- No particular title can satisfy all.
- The title should not be interpreted monolithically to define the document.
- Any title will be perceived by some to emphasize certain unintended positions.
- The current title does not suggest that the *Code of Conduct* is a "standard" nor is the document intended as such.
- Implementers are encouraged to adopt a title that suits their particular needs.

Alternative titles to consider include: Aviators Code of Ethics; Aviators Code of Practices; Aviators Core Excellence; Aviators' Guidelines; Aviators Values Initiative; Building Airmanship; Educational Materials for Pilots; General Aviation Airmanship Initiative; Guidance for GA Pilots; Guiding Principles for Aviators; Principles of Airmanship; Principles to Attain Aviation Excellence; Recommended Practices Guidelines; Responsible Pilot: Recommended Aviation Practices; Rules to Live By; The Airmanship Initiative; The Aviators Initiative; and The Responsible Pilot's Guide to General Aviation. Implementers may substitute one of these or any other title that fits their needs.
